RELIGION

LEVEL 3

STANDARD 1: CREED - Students will demonstrate understanding of core Catholic beliefs.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Discover that God speaks through the Bible and the Church.
- 2. Reflect on the meaning that God is holy and everlasting.
- 3. Summarize how God is present in creation and how all creation reveals the beauty of the Creator.
- 4. Discuss that Mary is the Mother of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 5. Retell that God sent his only son to save all people from sin.
- 6. Explain the Paschal Mystery life/death/resurrection/ascension of Jesus.
- 7. Reflect that through faith and baptism they join with Jesus and the Church and share in the mission of the church.

STANDARD 2: WORSHIP AND SACRAMENTS - Students will demonstrate understanding and practice of Catholic worship and sacraments with an emphasis on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of Catholics.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that we celebrate God's love in the sacraments.
- 2. Explain the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation.
- 3. Explain the healing sacraments: Reconciliation and Anointing of the sick.
- 4. Explain the sacraments of service: Matrimony, Holy Orders.
- 5. Understand the Church year, Paschal Mystery, Easter Triduum, Ordinary Time.

STANDARD 3: MORALITY - Students will understand right from wrong and be able to make good moral choices in life decisions that are consistent with Church teachings and a Christian life style.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand they are children of God through words and actions.
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of examination of conscience.
- 3. Explain the difference between a sin, an accident and a mistake.
- 4. Demonstrate how to express sorrow.
- 5. Understand that God will forgive them.
- 6. Understand the relationship between actions and consequences.

STANDARD 4: SOCIAL JUSTICE - Students will demonstrate understanding of Catholic social teaching and apply these principles to social and personal situations.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Demonstrate respect for all creation.
- 2. Demonstrate the dignity of the human person in work and play.
- 3. Appreciate the diverse roles of members in a community.
- 4. Explain good versus poor working conditions.
- 5. Explain conscience.

STANDARD 5: CORE SCRIPTURE - Students will read, interpret, and apply Scripture to their own daily life situation.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Retell and explain stories of Jesus, especially the Wedding feast of Cana, Pharisee and tax collector.
- 2. Reverence and understand that the Bible is a special holy book, the Word of God.
- 3. Introduce sections of the Bible: Pentateuch, Historical, Wisdom, Prophets, Gospels, Epistles, etc.
- 4. Memorize appropriate scripture passages that are appropriate for what is being learned.

STANDARD 6: FAMILY LIFE - Students will demonstrate their understanding of Christian family life and how it is nourished and passed on.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that all life is a gift from God.
- 2. Understand that human families are unique and different than animal families.
- 3. Understand that God created people to think, wonder and choose.
- 4. Understand and demonstrate that Jesus wants people to care for themselves and all others.
- 5. Understand that plants and animals should be respected as God's creation; plants reproduce through pollination; animals reproduce through fertilization.
- 6. Understand that through the love of mothers and fathers, humans share in God's gift of procreation.
- 7. Understand and demonstrate that everyone has a responsibility to care for the Earth, all living things and all people.

STANDARD 7: LITURGICAL YEAR - Students will demonstrate their understanding of the Liturgical year and how it is celebrated.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Understand seasons of Advent and Christmas and how they are celebrated.

2. Understand seasons of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter and how they are celebrated.

STANDARD 8: CHRISTIAN PRAYER AND PRACTICE - Students will be able to demonstrate, understand, use and identify traditional prayer forms in the Catholic tradition.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Experience and identify prayer forms of thanksgiving, praise, forgiveness and petition.
- 2. Experience and understand individual and communal prayer.
- 3. Know Jesus as our model of prayer.
- 4. Understand the meaning of the command to "Pray always."
- 5. Understands and uses prayers taught on list in "Continuum of Prayers Taught."

STANDARD 9: VOCABULARY - Students will be able to demonstrate understanding and use of religious vocabulary.

OBJECTIVES:

Refer to "Vocabulary to be Taught" and the Glossary.

STANDARD 10: VOCATION – LIFE STYLES - Students will demonstrate their understanding of different vocations and life styles to prepare them to respond to their own call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand our individual gifts and share them with others.
- 2. Identify the needs of the community and reach out to others.
- 3. Identify the needs of the world and ways we can help.
- 4. Identify and describe those who have service jobs in our community: health care providers, police, fire department, teachers, priests and ministers, etc.
- 5. Understand the special ministry of clergy and religious leaders.
- 6. Understand that each of us is called by God to a special vocation in life.

STANDARD 11: SERVICE - Students will engage in service to the community (family, parish, local, national, and global) by action and reflection on our response to the Gospel call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that we are all united in Christ and the need to care for all God's people.
- 2. Explain how they can put the Corporal Works of Mercy into action.
- 3. Actively participate in service projects.

STANDARD 12: SAINTS - Students will explore the lives of the saints in order to expand their role models for Christian living.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Celebrate and understand feasts of Mary especially Our Lady of Guadalupe (12/12).
- 2. Celebrate and understand the feasts of Our Lord especially Presentation of the Lord.
- 3. Celebrate and understand the life and feast of canonized saints:
 - a. Peter (2/22)
 - b. James and Philip (4/3)
 - c. John, the evangelist (12/27)
 - d. Thomas, apostle (7/13)
 - e. Elizabeth Seton (1/4)
 - f. Frances Cabrini (11/13)
- 4. Celebrate and understand the life of modern day saints:

Pope John Paul VI

STANDARD 13: CHURCH HISTORY – Students will understand and explore the development and history of the Church.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Discuss the lineage and role of the Pope, beginning with Peter.
- 2. Discuss and understand the Diocesan structure
- 3 Discuss and understand the Parish structure

STANDARD 14: STEWARDSHIP – Students will demonstrate an understanding of Catholic stewardship and apply the knowledge by sharing their time, talent and treasure.

- 1. Understand the core of stewardship as gratitude through actions.
- 2. God's gift of life each day is a sign that He has a mission for us that day.
- 3. Each person is given many gifts both spiritual and temporal
- 4. Not everyone has the same gifts and talents. Gifts and talents need to be shared
- 5. We are God's instruments God works through each of us to make his message known
